After bringing patient into exam room	Verify patient identifiers and verify they match order	<ul> <li>Ask the patient to tell you their full name and DOB, this should be correlated with patient facesheet or with order visible to caregiver.</li> <li>If patient is unable to verbalize information, patient name band should be used.
