Why it's Important

To provide education for proper IV insertion competencies for non-licensed clinical personnel

What do I need to know?

Non-RN Clinical Staff should understand the process to follow for completing computer based IV insertion training, hands on training and skill pass off.

Key Points

- Complete CBT training Peripheral Intravenous Catheter (PIV) Insertion Certification Course (#251637)
- Meet with your unit educator, clinical coach, or RN/MA Coordinator to receive hands-on simulation training

- Complete successful patient IV starts with an assigned preceptor, coach or RN/MA Coordinator
- Document assessment of the following competencies for IV insertion and removal in Kahuna
 - 3295 Demonstrate insertion and care of a patient with a peripheral IV including: administration of non-pharmacologic comfort measures prior to placement, selection of appropriate catheter size, selection of appropriate PIV site, handoff process after two unsuccessful PIV starts, connect primed tubing via extension set, apply dressing, label (dressing, tubing), apply stabilization device (if applicable), document all unsuccessful attempts and all successful IVs, etc
 - K6413 Demonstrate insertion of peripheral IV x3
 - 5835 Demonstrate care and removal of Peripheral IV's

Tips

- Caregivers will need permission from their manager, RN/MA Coordinator to complete CBT training.
- Departments should have a significant IV placement volume so caregivers can stay competent with their skills.
