



## **Travel Nurse HAI Prevention Guide**

Thank you for joining our team! Here are a few tips to help us prevent Hospital Acquired Infections (HAIs) in our patients.

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	Perform Hand Hygiene before and after touching a Central line. Assist patient in performing
	hand hygiene frequently.
	Change dressing every 7 days unless wet, loose, or soiled, then change as soon as possible.
	Dressing changes are done on Thursdays unless needed.
	<ul> <li>If using gauze under dressing, change every 48 hrs.</li> </ul>
	Keep alcohol caps on ports when not in use. Use an alcohol scrub when alcohol caps aren't
	being used, if port becomes contaminated, and with each sequential access.
	<ul> <li>Use a new cap each time one is removed.</li> </ul>
	Change needleless connectors every 96 hours or when occluded or soiled.
	Flush line every 12 hours when not in use.
	Document blood return every 12 hours.
	Daily bathing is important. CHG treatment after bathing required for all patients in ICUs and for
	patients with Central Lines on acute care.
	When drawing a blood culture, peripheral sticks are preferred. Do not draw blood cultures from
	Central Lines.
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	Perform <b>Hand Hygiene</b> before and after touching a Foley Catheter. Assist patient in performing
	hand hygiene frequently.
	Keep foley below the bladder during transports and when ambulating.
	Perform peri- cares with Provon wipes every shift and after incontinence or stooling.
	Keep foley secure with a Stat-lock to prevent pistoning.
	Maintain a closed system (keep tamper seal intact).
	Use two caregivers during insertion to maintain sterile field.
	Remove foley as soon as possible when no longer clinically indicated.
	Perform daily bathing to reduce bioburden.
	Check with the Charge nurse before sending a urine sample to assure the correct steps are
	taken for collection.



## CDI

Perform Hand Hygiene before and after any cares. Assist patient in performing hand hygiene
frequently. After a Cdiff diagnosis, Hand hygiene should be performed with soap and water.
Perform daily bathing to reduce bioburden.
High touch cleaning should be performed every shift. After a C-diff diagnosis, high touch
cleaning should be performed with bleach.
If the patient has diarrhea on admit, ask the doctor about sending a C-diff sample before
hospital day 4.
Check with the Charge nurse before sending a C-diff sample to ensure the correct steps are
taken for collection and that the test has been ordered appropriately
